

ISIpedia Stakeholder demands

1.Food/Agriculture

Crop yield, changes in growing season, Livestock production, agricultural prices

2.Water

Water availability, water quality, water demands per sector, water intensity per energy technology, water stress

3.Biodiversity

Species richness, species distribution, habitat suitability,

distribution of climate alien drive species

4.Biomes/ forestry

Forest area, carbon sequestration, forest production, NPP

5.Health

Air quality, malaria risk, temperature related mortality

6.Energy

Future energy mix, share of renewable energies (breakdown per source) energy availability heating costs

7.Coastal areas

Sea-level rise, sea intrusion

Fishery production or total catch

Planning

- ET to make it available online when published
